ORDER

For the reasons stated in open court, defendant's pro se motions to unseal documents referred to in court on April 22, 2002 (Docket #s 124 and 131) are DENIED; defendant's pro se Motion for Change of Venue and the Reduction in the Over Representation of Government Employees in the Potential Jury Pool is DENIED; Defendant's pro se Emergency Motion for Immediate Release from Detention and the Dropping of All Charges is DENIED; the Government's Motion Regarding Victims' Rights Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3510(b) is GRANTED; and the Government's Motion to Withhold Places of Abode of Prospective Witnesses Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3432 is GRANTED.¹ The defendant's re-arraignment on the Superseding Indictment renders MOOT his outstanding request for a hearing regarding a change of plea (Docket #134).

¹Defendant's Motion to Compel Production of Discovery (Docket #s 179 and 180) and Defendant's Motion to Suppress Statements (Docket #181) have been WITHDRAWN.

On Monday, June 24, 2002, the Court issued an order granting defendant's request for additional time to file pretrial motions and setting Monday, July 8, 2002 as the deadline by which all such motions must be filed; and it is hereby

ORDERED that any responses to pretrial motions must be filed by Monday, July 15, 2002. If oral argument will assist the Court in resolving any motion, the motions hearing will be rescheduled from Thursday, July 11, 2002 to Thursday, July 18, 2002 at 1:00 p.m.

On Friday, June 21, 2002, the defendant, pro se, filed a number of motions, most of which were unsealed by Order dated June 24, 2002. Having been advised by the United States that it does not object to the placement of certain additional pleadings in the open case file, it is hereby

ORDERED that pleadings previously docketed as #s 201, 202, 212 and 213 be and are unsealed.

The Court is in receipt of a pleading filed by Charles Freeman, Esq. on behalf of himself entitled "Is This How Alexandria Division Treats Its Guests?" Because Mr. Freeman is not an attorney of record in this case, it is hereby

ORDERED that this pleading be and is filed only for administrative purposes.

The Clerk is directed to forward copies of this Order to the defendant, pro se; counsel for the United States; standby defense

counsel; the Court Security Officer; and the United States
Marshal.
